Announcing the 2023 European Capitals of Inclusion & Diversity Award

10 January 2023

The <u>European Capitals of Inclusion and Diversity Award</u> is back for a second edition. The European Commission will unveil the winners at a ceremony on **27 April 2023**. Applications can be submitted until 15 February 2023.

European Commissioner for Equality Helena Dalli will host the high-level event, which gathers mayors, national officials, diversity and inclusion stakeholders and policymakers.

The Award recognises Gold, Silver and Bronze winners in all three categories:

- local authorities with less than 50 000 inhabitants
- local authorities with more than 50 000 inhabitants
- special award for LGBTIQ+ equality

The first prize winners will be named 'European Capitals of Inclusion and Diversity' for one year.

About the #DiversityCapitals Competition

The Award recognises the work done by cities, towns, or regions in the European Union to promote inclusion and create discrimination-free societies.

The competition is a chance for local authorities to showcase policies and initiatives that create more diverse and inclusive spaces for their citizens.

It covers diversity and inclusion initiatives that tackle all discrimination grounds (sex, racial or ethnic origin, religion or belief, disability, age, or sexual orientation) and intersectionality, the interconnected relationship of different forms of social categorisation.

- Entries submissions: until 15 February 2023, at 12h00 PM CET
- Expert and jury evaluation of entries: between 16 February and 31 March 2023
- Announcement of finalists: early April 2023 (expected)
- Prize-giving ceremony: 27 April 2023
